RESIDENT CONCERN #1

35% of survey particiapnts said they need help with food insecurity.

RESIDENT CONCERN #2

24% of respondents said they wanted fitness and exercise activities.

RESIDENT CONCERN #3

56% of participants said illness or injury prevented daily activities or self care. 14% said they delayed care due to lack of transportation. Community councils serve as forums for addressing neighborhood concerns such as such as homelessness, crime, or changes to bus routes.
